Unhindered: Private Conclusions and Life Outcomes

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To start out this morning

Let me tell you a story about a guy named Nick

Nick is his name

But that's probably not how you know him

You know Nick because he was a scientist

But that would have been surprising to him

And to those who knew him

Because although Nick had a PhD

It wasn't in science

He didn't really work as a scientist

That was almost like a hobby for him

He worked as a businessman

An administrator

A manager

But those aren't the reasons why you know him

His PhD was in Canon Law

Which is a study of Catholic legal principles

But Nick wasn't a priest

And, again, his work in the church is not why you know His name

You know Nick because he solved

A scientific debate of his time

And that would have maybe surprised him also

Because, again, he wasn't really a scientist

Scientists of his day

Had two theories

That they fought over

Let's call them theory 1

And theory 2

Some scientists believed theory 1

And they had facts that lined up behind it

Making theory 1 seem true

But we know now it wasn't true

Some believed theory 2

And they had different facts that lined up behind it

Making theory seem true

But we know now that theory 2 also wasn't true

Nick discovered that a belief

That almost all scientists of his day believed

A foundational idea that made theory 1 and theory 2 even possible

Nick discovered that this belief wasn't true

And all of us today know it's untrue

Elementary school science textbooks today

Will teach Nick's theory as truth

Without any real debate

In fact

If anyone today proposed an alternative theory today

They would be ridiculed

In much the same way that Nick's theory was ridiculed

When he proposed it

In fact – this is good

Nick was so insecure about his proposal

That the book he wrote

The one that made him famous

He published it under his assistant's name originally

He went back and forth with the publisher

For more than a decade before they would even publish it

And when they finally did publish it

They changed its name

Without his knowledge or permission

And they added a "letter to the reader" at the front

Also, without his knowledge or permission

The letter to the reader basically said

This book is just a theory

Which doesn't even pretend to be true

So, don't freak out

But people did freak out

Even though it was true

Because they were utterly convinced

It was a lie

...

And now I'm going to make you wait

What lies

Does our culture today emphatically believe to be true?

What truths does our culture emphatically believe But they're actually lies?

Remember, the German people

Freely elected Hitler

Many of America's founding fathers – our politicians

Personally owned slaves

We all know, today

How heinous those two decisions were

None of us today

Would vote for someone from the Nazi party

Or would vote for someone who endorsed slavery

History reveals

Many blind spots

That were simply hidden at the time

I mean, heck

Some of us had blind spots

That were simply hidden at the time {80's hair pic}

Let me ask again:

What lies

Does our culture today emphatically believe to be true?

What truths does our culture emphatically believe

But they're actually lies?

This is a core piece of

The Apostle Paul's letter to the Romans

The Roman culture

Had become corrupt and selfish

And their behavior and lifestyles

Were vile in the sight of God

So, Paul was exhorting the church in Rome

To *act* differently

To believe differently

To think differently

Romans 12:2a (NLT) - Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think.

There are patterns in our world

Paul says

That do not align with the ways of God

If we're honest, we'd admit

That there are patterns in each of our minds

That do not align with the ways of God

And it is imperative

For the follower of Jesus

To allow God to transform you into a new person

How?

By changing the way you think

You see this all throughout Scripture

Amy & I were talking just the other day

And she had this brilliant insight

And you thought she was just

Prettier than me

So, Moses had been adopted

By Pharaoh's daughter

But he knew that

He was Hebrew

So, one day

He leaves the palace

And goes out to where his people lived

And he sees

Maybe for the first time

An Egyptian picking

On a Hebrew

Exodus 2:11-12 (NIV) - One day, after Moses had grown up, he went out to where his own people were and watched them at their hard labor. He saw an

Egyptian beating a Hebrew, one of his own people. Looking this way and that and seeing no one, he killed the Egyptian and hid him in the sand.

"Hid him in the sand"?!?

This is like an episode from the Soprano's or something

Moses is a gangster!

So, he goes back to the palace

And he must've thought to himself

I got away with it

Nobody saw me

I really am a gangster

So, the next day

He goes back out to the Hebrew area

But this time

He sees two Hebrews fighting with each other

He steps in – just like before

And intervenes

Exodus 2:14 (NIV) - The man said, "Who made you ruler and judge over us? Are you thinking of killing me as you killed the Egyptian?" Then Moses was afraid and thought, "What I did must have become known."

No more gangster

Now that's a key text

For the history of Moses

Pharaoh finds out

He pursues Moses

Moses flees to Midian

It's a key text for Moses

But I think it's also a key text for us

Because for forty years

This scene played out in Moses' mind

"Who are you?"

"Who made you ruler and judge over us?"

"Who do you think you are?"

Fast-forward forty years

God comes to Moses

It's time for him to pursue his destiny

God speaks to him from a burning bush

Calls him to go to Pharaoh

And what does Moses say?

What's his first response to the call of God?

Look carefully

Exodus 3:11 (NIV) - But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?"

Moses' deep insecurity

The lie that Moses has internalized

Becomes the obstacle to his faith

"Who am I?"

Notice God doesn't chastise him for feeling that way

He doesn't get mad

He simply says,

It'll be ok

Exodus 3:12 (NIV) - And God said, "I will be with you."

The salve for Moses' deepest wound

The salve for *our* deepest wounds

Is the very presence of God

The balm for our most pressing insecurities

Is walking... in the presence... of our Creator

James 4:8a (NIV) – Come near to God and He will come near to you.

You were designed to live

Close to God

Near to Him

Many of us sit here this morning

Unsure of where we stand with God

Have I done too much?

Have I gone too far?

James promises us

That what we need most

Is readily available

Come near to God and He will come near to you

Let me ask again

But let me be a little more direct this time

What lies

Do you emphatically believe to be true?

What truths do you emphatically believe

But they're actually lies?

This is where this unhindering process

Gets real

This is where

The rubber hits the road

Let me show you a great diagram

That the authors created

That shows us where we get off track

The events in our life

The words and events that shape our heart

And the sore spots from living in a broken world

Create faulty logic

In our mind and heart

And from that logic

We create strategies

Some people call them "defense mechanisms"

Some people call them "survival techniques"

But we strategically devise ways

To survive in a broken world

With beliefs and truths

That sincerely feel true to us

We hide

Or live in denial

We settle

Or become very independent

We numb ourselves

Through shutting down

Or thru activities and addictions

To numb us

We may compartmentalize our life

Or be overly driven to achievement

To somehow prove our worth

We become control freaks

Or stay super busy

Or choose unhealthy coping mechanisms

This list leads to a lot of pain

And a lot of confusion

But this list is familiar

To many of us

But God has a different plan in mind

God wants to transform you into a new person by changing the way you think

He wants to rewrite those painful parts of your past

So that they become a place of strength

2 Corinthians 1:3b-4 - God is our merciful Father and the source of all comfort. He comforts us in all our troubles so that we can comfort others. When they are troubled, we will be able to give them the same comfort God has given us.

God doesn't cause all of the difficult things in our lives

But He can utilize them

They're experience for us

And He's not going to waste that experience

So, when He leads you through it

He'll have you help lead someone else through it

And that brings purpose and meaning to your pain

He comforts us in all our troubles

So that we can comfort others.

Then, as He transforms the way that we think

Our heart logic will be healthy and strong

Which will lead us to Truth and strategies

That actually work in our lives

And that's good news

That's hope

And sometimes

Sometimes

Hope is the starting point to healing

Proverbs 12:25 (NIV) - Anxiety weighs down the heart, but a kind word cheers it up.

God is not saying that one kind word

Fixes everything you're facing

But kind words bring hope

And hope... over time... can bring great healing

Let's go back

And finish Ole Nick's story

From the beginning of the message

Nicolaus Copernicus

Was born in 1473

Although astronomy and science

Were always a part of his life

It never was the main focus of education

Or the main focus of his career

And yet

This is a true story

On his death bed

His seminal book

Proposing a helio-centric view of the universe

That the earth revolved around the sun

Instead of the sun and planets revolving around the earth

His newly published book

Was placed in his hand for the first time

On his death bed

After his death

For hundreds of years

The debate about his theory raged on in the scientific community

Some called it "interesting"

Others believed it was "dangerous"

Some thought it was "ridiculous"

Others said it was "heresy"

Because everyone just knew

That the earth was the center of our universe

Anything else, they believed

Was a lie

Once people changed that mindset

It's hard to convince yourself

That you're not the center of the universe

But once people changed that mindset

It opened the door for them to see clearly

About everything else

That's the same decision

We face today

Many of us

I would likely say all of us

Certainly, I would include me

Have lies in our heart

In our emotions

And in our thinking

That we sincerely believe to be true

And those lies hinder us

Those lies cause us pain

And lead us to cause pain to others

And God wants to set us free

The pathway forward

To unhinder ourselves

Involves increased trust in God

Believing in His Word

Believing in His claims about us

And involves increased submission to God

Yielding our hearts to Him

Proverbs 3:5-6 (NIV) - Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to Him, and He will make your paths straight.

Trust God with all of your heart

All of your emotions

All of your thinking

Trust the Lord

And lean not on your own understanding

On your own emotions

On your own thinking

In all of your ways submit to Him

And He will make your paths straight

I love the Contemporary English Translation of verse 6

Proverbs 3:6 (CEV) - Always let Him lead you, and He will clear the road for you to follow.

That imagery just grabbed me

The picture of God

Clearing a path for us

In a dense jungle

Sometimes

For some of us

The clearing that's needed

Is just minor

A little weed eating

Maybe pull a few weeds

Minor

Other times

The task for our God

Is extreme

We feel like we're in a dense jungle

With lots of undergrowth

And vines

And pitfalls

And dangers

So, when Proverbs says:

"He will clear the road for you to follow"

That can mean different things

To different people

At different times in their life

For those of us

I'm choosing my pronouns carefully

For those of us

Who feel a little more like dense jungle

And a little less like a weedy subdivision sidewalk

Let me give you a word of encouragement

Today

This is an actual picture of a jungle in New Zealand

So is this

You don't have to have the whole forest cleared

If you have a pathway thru

You don't have to be as powerful as the Pharaoh

If God is with you

And you don't have to have all the answers

Because you can trust in God

But submitting to God

May require you to change some of your assumptions

Submitting to God

May require you to let God transform you into a new person

By changing the way you think

I want to invite you

Beg you, honestly

To submit all your thinking to God

That He may transform your thinking
